
Welcome to Worship at Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church!

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering

Since 1949, Presbyterians have joined with millions of other Christians through One Great Hour of Sharing to share God's love with people in need. Our gifts support ministries of disaster response, refugee assistance and resettlement, and community development that help people find safe refuge, start new lives and work together to strengthen their families and communities. Recognizing that the hope we have in Christ is lived out in our hope for one another, we respond with gifts that help our sisters and brothers around the world find the hope for a brighter future.

Where does the money go? The Presbyterian Hunger Program receives 36 percent of undesignated One Great Hour of Sharing gifts, while the Self -Development of People and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance each receive 32 percent. In addition to helping brothers and sisters around the world, communities and congregations in the Presbytery of the Peaks have recently received the following assistance, made possible by your OGHS gifts: \$3,500 from the Presbyterian Hunger Program for Two Centsa-Meal; \$7,500 from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) to assist with rebuilding of homes in the Elon area following last spring's tornado damage: \$5,000 from PDA for Fairlawn Presbyterian Church to assist with repairing flood damage. An envelope and pamphlet are in the pews for those who wish to participate.
