QMPC/UNIVERSITY OF LYNCHBURG/LYNCHBURG MUSEUM SYSTEM PARTNERSHIP PROGRESS REPORT

In 2022 QMPC, the University of Lynchburg, and the Lynchburg Museum System formed a partnership to enhance the South River Meeting House interpretive program so that the story of Lynchburg's early Quakers and their South River Meeting House might be shared more widely and effectively. This initiative has already produced impressive results, with more exciting projects in the works.

Partnership accomplishments to date include a weatherproof Meeting House brochure holder made by Lowell Milton and installed by him and Bob Lockridge near the Meeting House's main entrance; regularly scheduled Meeting House tours by Lynchburg Museum System staff; Meeting House tour guide training of several University of Lynchburg history students; wreath laying ceremonies at John Lynch's grave and Meeting House tours during celebrations of Lynch's birthday; mulching and periwinkle around John Lynch's grave, thanks to Bob Lockridge; and cleaning of the plaque on Lynch's grave marker so it is legible.

Upcoming activities and events include an April 24 public lecture at 5:30pm by Lynchburg Museum System staff member Rebecca Pickard titled "The Last Sayings of Sarah Lynch Terrell' and the Radical Abolitionism of South River Quakers," preceded and followed by a Meeting House open house with University of Lynchburg history student tour guides available to answer questions; a mini-museum in the Meeting House tack room being designed by University of Lynchburg students; cleaning of the plaque next to the Meeting House's main entrance; a Lynchburg's Pioneer Quakers and Their Meeting House presentation on Oct. 2 for Life@Lynchburg (University of Lynchburg by Ted Delaney, executive director of the Lynchburg Museum System; Carolyn Eubank, QMPC member and chair of the South River Meeting House Restoration Committee; and Heidi Koring, a leader of the local Quaker Indulged Meeting.
