

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Grace & Peace to You my Friends,

The final days to the grave are upon us. We enter the month of April with Holy Week. We will begin with the procession of palms and shouts of Hosanna to only have them drowned out by the cries of Crucify Him on Good Friday...but we know that Easter Sunday is coming and we will gather as Christians have for generations to sing and shout and joyfully proclaim: Christ is Risen! My friends, I hope you will take time to be a part of our Holy Week observations. Maundy Thursday will be April 6 at 6:30pm in the Fellowship Hall and as this service will include a meal we need your reservations by Monday, April 3rd. We will gather in the Fellowship Hall for a meal followed by Communion


Good Friday, April 7 7:00pm Tenebrae Service in the Sanctuary

QMPC Earth Care

Did you know that QMPC has an Earth care team? Our team has been focused on Earth care at Quaker since the Earth care committee at Peaks Presbytery held a summit at Quaker last October. We learned about other churches that are also focused on Earth care. Bob Lockridge, Co-Chair of Missions is a member of the Presbytery Committee. In our Missions committee meetings, we have discussed focusing on earth care and what we can do to be better stewards of the earth.

We began recycling all of our paper, plastic and cardboard and limiting our use of plastic ware. We no longer purchase styrofoam products and are beginning to use our stainless flatware at meals.

We've had a community garden for the past 9 years and donate all vegetables to the local foodbank, the Salvation Army and Daily Bread. Last year, we donated over 1000 pounds of fresh vegetables.

The Property Committee has worked hard to make our building more energy efficient and safer. We also began sharing our classroom space with local homeschool groups and several other groups use our space for meetings.

Our team will meet quarterly and focus on Earth care education. We will celebrate Earth Day this year on 4/23 after worship by planting a couple of memorial trees and serving refreshments outdoors. We plan to create a section on our bulletin board that focuses on earth care and continue to improve our recycle efforts and use less products that do not recycle.

Our Rise Against Hunger Meals

We have learned that the meals we packed in January were delivered to the Timor-Leste Salesian Mission. TIMOR-LESTE: Rise Against Hunger rice-meal shipment provides nutrition for 11 Salesian centers

The shipment ensured students and rural community members had healthy nutrition during the COVID-19 pandemic.

NEW ROCHELLE, NY (Dec. 13, 2021) Youth attending Salesian schools and youth centers in Timor-Leste had access to better nutrition thanks to a partnership between Salesian Missions, the U.S. development arm of the Salesians of Don Bosco, and Rise Against Hunger, an international relief organization that provides food and life-changing aid to the world's most vulnerable. A 2020 shipment provided donated rice-meals to ensure students and rural community members had healthy nutrition during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Don Bosco Foundation, the main recipient of the donation, shared the rice-meals among 11 Salesian centers and programs. Don Bosco Technical School Fatumaca, Don Bosco Technical High School Maliana, Don Bosco Training Center of Comoro, Don Bosco Laga Youth Center, and Don Bosco Lospalos Orphanage were among the recipients of the donation. The donation also went to Salesian primary and secondary schools and a local prison.

One of the recipients, Don Bosco Technical School Fatumaca, provides vocational education that helps youth gain an education and prepare for the future. More than 250 students, 11 percent of whom are girls, attend the school taking three-year courses in carpentry, mechanics and electronics. Each year there are more than 400 applications for 84 student spots. Final year students are required to design and produce a product that embraces much of what they have learned over the previous three years.

"Hungry students have trouble focusing on their studies and learning," said Father Gus Baek, director of Salesian Missions. "Salesians provide feeding programs in their schools and centers so youth are able to fully take part in the activities and school lessons. During the pandemic, when so many families faced an extra financial burden due to a lack of work, the food ensured that families had healthy nutrition to survive."

Timor-Leste is home to 1.3 million people and has close to 49 percent of its population living in poverty with over one-third of the population regularly experiencing food shortages. In addition, close to 50 percent of the population is illiterate, according to the World Bank.

Salesian missionaries in Timor-Leste have been providing programs to help residents recover and rebuild in the wake of a devastating civil war in the country that claimed countless lives, decimated entire communities and resulted in living conditions that are among the worst in the world. Now that the violence has subsided, efforts are being focused on helping the poor, restoring hope and providing new opportunities for the future.





There are two scholarship opportunities for local students that are members of Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church:

The Weigand Scholarship provides financial assiance to QMPC and other church members in the Lynchburg area. Students seeking an undergraduate degree with financial need are encouraged to apply. The deadline to apply for this scholarship is April 17, 2023.

The G. Rudolph Leonard Scholarship, distributed by First Presbyterian Church, is available to active members of any Presbyterian Church (USA) which is located within a nine-mile radius of the Presbytery Office. The amount of the annual grant will vary according to need and availability. The deadline to apply for this scholarship is 3:00 p.m. on Friday, May 5, 2023.

Information and applications for both scholarhips are avilable in the Church Office.


