A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Christ is Risen!

It never gets old to say those words of hope and promise: Christ is Risen!! We are resurrection people...we are people who know the joy of an empty tomb on Easter morn. We are resurrection people who know with certainty that death does not have the final word.

One of my earliest memories of church is Easter. Maybe because on Easter there always seems to be extra stuff like lots of white lilies, trumpets and packed out pews. Maybe because preparation for Easter started weeks ahead with ashes placed on foreheads. Maybe after weeks of singing mostly hymns in a minor key we finally get to sing loudly the Alleluias of Easter. Maybe because the search for the perfect Easter dress with bonnet and gloves was over and I could finally wear them to church. I have always resonated with poet, Anne Sexton's poem Protestant Easter, 8 Years Old:

When he was a little boy Jesus was good all the time They pounded nails into his hands After that well, After that Everyone wore hats... The important thing for me Is that I'm wearing white gloves.

Too bad we don't wear white gloves anymore, but we will gather once again in our Easter finery to hear the story of the women who made their way to the empty tomb and boldly proclaimed: Christ is not here, he is risen, alleluia! Christ is risen, indeed! I invite each and every one of you to invite someone else (a friend, a neighbor, a family member) to join us Easter morning and join us in the Good News—white gloves not required but open hearts are always welcome!
