LENTEN OBSERVANCES

LENT: A time of Preparation

In the early church, Lent was the time of preparation for baptism on Easter. Over the years it became a forty day devotional preparation for Easter based on Jesus' wilderness fast. This year with times of quarantine and stay-at-home orders due to the COVID pandemic, it has felt as though we were in a year-long season of Lent.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday with a solemn service that reminds us of the "pervasiveness of human sin and of the inevitability of human death. Ashes are placed on the forehead or back of the hand to represent that which, in the human experience was burned out and wasted that which once was, but is no more. This traditional emblem of grief and mourning has been adopted by the Christian Church as a signal of our own sinful mortality; it has also been embraced as a mutual trumpet to warn of the coming dark days in Jesus' Life: his passion and death" (Texts for Preaching, Year B, pg. 182, Walter Brueggemann, et all.)

It is challenging enough at Christmas time to grapple with the concept of Christ's incarnation – God with us. But it is imperative to also understand Jesus to be 100% divine and 100 % human. The letter to Hebrews 2:10-11 states that Christ is creator as an instrument of God, for whom and by whom all things exist. Christ is also Redeemer, tasting death for everyone as an agent of God who brings God's children to salvation. In this, Christ functions as High Priest whose ritual of sacrifice on behalf of himself and human beings bring people and himself before the holy presence of God. Because Jesus shared humanity with people in every respect he could identify humanity's struggle with sin, evil and death and help people overcome their fear of death. Because Jesus was fully divine, he had the power to overcome sin, death and evil.

May the season of Lent this year draw you deeper into an understanding of God's gift of salvation and the great promise of hope today and peace for all eternity. The disciplines of Lent: fasting, giving, service, prayer, meditation, honest assessment of our lives and worship, all help prepare us to face the reality of who we are and whose we are as we prepare for the glory of Easter.


choice and login to Zoom. Check your email for an invitation with the login link.
