## WHO ARE WE?

February is recognized as the LOVE month. One of the reasons for this is the celebration of Valentine's Day. A day that often has as much pressure on it as does Christmas and family birthdays in terms of remembering and expressing affection for our loved ones. For many it is a month in which people wonder, "Am I really loved?" Others also ask themselves, "How well do I love others? And a third question, "Who am I in relation to what I do, what I believe and those to whom I am attached?"

In Matthew 5:1, Jesus specifically speaks to his disciples, those who believe enough and trust enough to follow Jesus, taking him seriously and being changed by him. And he assures them that they are already blessed by God. In a sense, the beatitudes, tell us who we already are – Children of God, blessed and called to do God's ministry here on earth. As such, this passage is a celebration text. It assures us of the abundant life that God has already given us. We are assured that we do not have to earn God's grace, we already have it. And it is as valid for you as it was for the first disciples. Praise the Lord!

With this grace and these blessings does come a call to serve and do God's ministry as we are God's hands, feet, minds, mouth, heart and spirit here on earth. The good news is that another lectionary text for this month gives us guidance on what faithful living looks like – living that loves others and ourselves. This text is from Micah 6:1-8. It is the scene of a courtroom where God is challenging the people regarding their worship and service to God in response to God's grace and mercy toward them. The people in defense respond with essentially, "Then what shall we do?" God's answer is "do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with your God"

- **Do Justice** live with integrity and be fair with those with whom we come into contact. Work on behalf of the oppressed, the poor and those caught up in injustice.
- Love Kindness (Mercy) share God's grace with others through your words and your actions. Do small acts of kindness for others.
- Walk humbly with your God to walk with is to stay close to and be available to. It is also to imitate what God does and who God is. Humbly is a key word here as it acknowledges our dependence on God and our need to take God more seriously than we do ourselves.



I challenge each of us this month to do one of these three things each day so that others may experience God's love and that we may be the people God created us to be. ## PNC Review of Pastor Information Forms (PIFs)

- Church Leadership Connection (CLC) matches QMPC Ministry Information Form (MIF) to PIFs
  Sends up to 25 PIFs to PNC every two weeks
- Each PNC member reviews and ranks each PIF
- PNC meets to compile and discuss rankings
  - · Some members will also choose to listen to sermons, review web sites
- PNC reaches consensus for each PIF
  - Those not appropriate for QMPC: send email no longer being considered
  - Those selected for further consideration: send affirming email
- · Continue process until 6 to 8 potential candidates identified
- Begin next steps of process, but continue receiving/reviewing PIFs
- Status of PIF review as of January 25, 2020:
  - Completed review of 44 PIFs
  - 9 pastors selected for further consideration in the process
- Next steps of process include:
  - Submit written questions to candidates and review responses
  - Check references, review sermons, review social media, etc.
- Will continue to request and review PIFs through February
  - Expect to review an additional 50 or more PIFs
  - · Will initiate second wave of process after PIF reviews
- Down-select 2-3 candidates for visit to Lynchburg, in-person interview, and sermon at local church

Happy New Year from your friends at Haiti Outreach Ministries!

As we begin 2020, I want to share several items of good news from Haiti.

• The political unrest in Haiti has been relatively calm since the early part of December. Our HOM/MICECC schools reopened on December 2 with good attendance at all four of our schools. After a short break for Christmas and New Year's, three schools reopened January 6 and Cite Soleil opened on January 7. It is a joy to see the children back in school!







• Because of your **generous response to our appeal for food relief**, HOM/MICECC have been able to distribute food in November and December to 4,577 families in Cite Soleil, Terre Noire, and Repatriote. We will also be able to distribute more food during the first four months of 2020. The people are so grateful to receive this food. Thank you for your caring!

• Our **new dentist** Dr. Patrick Saint Germain began work in the clinic this month. We also hired Marlene Alexis Jean Jacques to be the dental assistant. We are glad to have both of them on staff.

• We are scheduling US teams to start returning to Haiti in February. We are glad that we currently have 32 teams scheduled to travel to Haiti and partner with us. We look forward to welcoming more teams as plans are made.

Thank you for your partnership with HOM/MICECC. We are grateful for your support. Because of you, many good things are happening in the communities we serve.

We continue to stay in contact with our MICEEC mission partners and monitor the situation in Haiti closely. Please join me in continuing to pray for the people of Haiti and our ministry. **Much has been done, but many more possibilities are before us.**



Time Line

- Recruit a liaison from each church to the project for communications, publicity, and volunteer management
- January: Schedule first official Apostles Build meeting with liaisons and Greater Lynchburg Habitat For Humanity staff
- Introduce Partner Family who will be buying the home; review the schedule
- February: Organize awareness and fundraising campaigns underway within each church

Late March/April: Have a groundbreaking or wall raising ceremony

- Perform 12 weeks of construction (3+ work days available each week)
- Update participant congregations, including project promotion, and communication.
- June: Dedication ceremony with ribbon-cutting and celebration of success

#### It is easy to sign up or renew, just follow these steps:

Visit <u>http://www.kroger.com</u>, under **Savings & Rewards**, select **Kroger Community Rewards** 

• If you have NOT signed up your Kroger Plus card online before, you will need to create an account which requires some basic information, a valid email address and your Kroger Plus card. Give it a 24 - 48 hrs and then try to enroll.

• You can also call Kroger customer service. Make sure you have your Kroger Plus card handy because they will need the number on the back of the card. 1-800-KROGERS (1-800-576-4377) and select option 3. Tell the agent you want to enroll your Kroger Plus card in the community rewards program. Specify that your rewards go to Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church NPO # HH690.

• If you have signed up your Kroger Plus card online before, once logged into your Kroger account, search for **Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church either by name or HH690** and then click Enroll.

If you do not have a Kroger Plus card, please go to the customer service desk at any Kroger and they will help you get one.
