Highlights from the June 2019 Session Meeting:

- A Safety Task Force was created and approved. Those on the task force are: Tim Roach, John Lanier, Phyllis Beilfus and Sam Leslie. (Nancy Dawson, ex-officio)
- A revised Adult Choir Director Position Description was presented and approved.
- Property Task force presented their findings. A Capitol Campaign for raising up to \$250,000 for improvements was presented and approved.
- Approved \$795 from Memorial Fund for installing handrails at the chancery steps.
- A session retreat will be July 19-20 at Eagle Eyrie. Spending \$95 for meals & 1 nights lodging was approved. The agenda will be reviewing data collected during the discernment process and identifying priorities for the church for the next 3 years.
- We are now allowed to send 2 commissioners from QMPC to the Presbytery meetings. Approved Neal Gibson to attend in August, and Nikki Kariuki to attend in November.
- Discussion of serving communion to shut-ins was held and a plan was established.

There is a lot of love in this church that we would like to share with our community to let them know

You can earn money for missions when you register your Kroger Plus card. Here is how to do it:


Visit http://www.kroger.com, under Savings & Rewards, select Kroger Community Rewards

- If you have NOT signed up your Kroger Plus card online before, you will need to create an account which requires some basic information, a valid email address and your Kroger Plus card. Give it a 24 48 hrs and then try to enroll.
- You can also call Kroger customer service. Make sure you have your Kroger Plus card handy because they will need the number on the back of the card. 1-800-KROGERS (1-800-576-4377) and select option 3. Tell the agent you want to enroll your Kroger Plus card in the community rewards program. Specify that your rewards go to Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church NPO # HH690.
- If you have signed up your Kroger Plus card online before, once logged into your Kroger account, search for **Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church either by name or HH690** and then click Enroll.



If you do not have a Kroger Plus card, please go to the customer service desk at any Kroger and they will help you get one.
