COME ALL AND REST

One of the scripture passages in our lectionary for July 5 is Matthew 11:28-30: "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

"Discipleship is hard work. In the best of times, holding the demands and the gifts of being a follower of Christ can be wearying. Trying to respond to the demands of the day while also being open to God's gracious care is a difficult course. "Doing" and "being" are tricky to balance - all the more so when a pandemic has us shutting down and staying in, while the call for racial justice urges us to get up, get out and march. Jesus knew how we would struggle with these things." (Looking into the lectionary, The Presbyterian Outlook, John Wurster).

The first word in this passage is key as all the rest depend upon it. *Come*. It is the relentless invitation of God, who is always reaching out, always welcoming with open arms. Come. It is the word spoken by God throughout Scripture. God hungers for us to come to him and rely on him for guidance, support and grace. It has been said, when God feels distant, it is no God who has moved but us. This time of pandemic, stay at home orders, social distancing, masks, arduous hygiene measures demand that we come to God to lean on him and trust that he is at work in our lives.



The second key word in this passage is AII. "Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens". Not just some. Not just a few. Not just the qualified or the capable or the knowledgeable. But all. Those who do not do the good they want to do (Romans 7:2); those with scars; those with baggage. Those with questions; those with doubts; those with fears. Everyone is invited. Everyone is welcome. All. We don't have to earn the right to come or be worthy of God's relationship with us. God provides the grace that invites ALL to come.

The third key word is **Rest**. Rest from the relentless decisions, the new behaviors, the care of friends and loved ones. Rest from the financial worries, the health concerns, the relationships stretched to the max. Jesus seeks our good, comforts our weariness and bears our burdens, We are not given an exemption from pain, challenges and sorrow. But we are given a companion to walk with us. We are not alone. Jesus knows the challenges of life and is with us in them every minute of every day. As the Brief Statement of Faith for the PC (USA) says, "In live and in death we belong to God and nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

To be yoked to Jesus is to be attached as two oxen are connected by a wooden harness or yoke. They must walk in tandem and together they share the load. Jesus promises that "my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Wow! The garden is growing! Due lots of rain and a cooler spring, the garden is really growing strong. Many people help plant, weed and water to make this happen. And

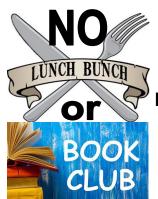


far this year over 455 pounds of produce had been donated to organizations who give to those in need.

thanks or petitioning on their behalf. Do it individually or with family and/or with friends. Be a prayer warrior for those in need and even those we think are not in need.



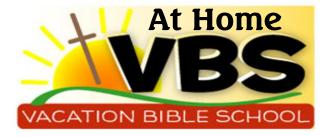
