Now imagine that you watch as Jesus heads in the direction of the desert following what appears to be a wisp of smoke. And as he passes you by he stops and asks you to join him. "Me?" you ask with amazement. "Yes, You", he says. You wonder why and where to and for how long and are acutely aware that neither of you have any supplies. But you push those thoughts aside and fall into step beside Jesus.

As you walk, the minutes turn into days, the days turn into weeks, and the weeks fly by. Much of your time is spent in silence, but often Jesus talks about His Father and his words are filled with so much love and intimacy that you are longing for the same. "You can have that kind of relationship, you know," He says one day. "You just have to believe in me and trust me and My Father." Not exactly sure what he means, you do find that you are filled with a peace you have never had before. And it almost makes you forget how hungry you are.

Suddenly there is someone else with you. You don't recognize him, nor do you feel at all comfortable in his presence. You sense that Jesus is not surprised that this "person" is with you, but he is not happy about it either. With a smirk on his face, the tempter (as you will come to know him) challenges Jesus by saying, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread." And you immediately think, BREAD, now that would be wonderful. Can Jesus do that? If so, why did he wait for 40 days? I am famished. But no sooner did you begin to imagine the delicious, warm taste of bread, Jesus answers the tempter, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God"

You remember hearing those words in worship not too long ago, but they did not have the same impact or meaning as they do now. And as the reality that God's Word is more important to life than even meeting one's physical needs, the fact that there will be no bread today begins to sink in. As you look at him, Jesus does not seem in the least bit perturbed and you remember his words, "You can have that kind of relationship with me and My Father, just believe in me and trust me and My Father."

Suddenly, the tempter leads Jesus to the holy city and has him stand on the highest point of the temple. "If you are the Son of God", the tempter said, "Throw yourself down for it is written, Your Father will protect you." But Jesus stood firm and said, "It is also written: 'Do not put the lord your God to the test." As you sense relief that Jesus will not be harmed, you realize that this tempter also knows God's Word and is good at using it. But Jesus knows and loves His Father and will honor Him above all.

Again the tempter took Jesus to a high mountain and showed him the kingdoms of the world. "All this I will give to you" the tempter said, "if you will bow down and worship me." Now you are scared and confused. "Doesn't Jesus already rule over all creation?" you think. And you know in your heart that for Jesus to worship the tempter would be the worst thing possible. Capital Campaign Update


We started our Capital Campaign in September of 2019 with the intent to raise \$250,000 to complete all the projects that the property task force presented to the session. We will finish the campaign on March 29th of 2020.

As of right now we have pledges of \$210,000 and have received \$205,000. We have enough funds on hand to complete all of our projects except one, the parking lot. A gracious thank you to everyone for supporting us so far.

I hope that everyone is seeing the fruits of our labors as the Property Task Force (now the Property Committee) has been very hard at work. You can see the new gutters and downspouts on the building, the new windows in the classrooms, the new heating/AC units, the repaired kitchen steps, and the repaired drainage. All of this is thanks to you and your generous support.

As we strive to finish out our campaign and complete our goal, we have reached out to four individuals that have agreed to challenge the rest of the congregation to support our final project, the parking lot. These members are matching the donations up to \$20,000 so that we can achieve our goal. We are asking each family to prayerfully consider donating \$200 more to the campaign to match this challenge.





Why do my members have to re-enroll

every year if they were already participating? Kroger Community Rewards will be evaluated each year as we continually work toward improving our program to ensure that we offer the best option for our customers and nonprofit organizations. Reenrollment gives each organization an opportunity to refresh their membership by spreading the word to new members and keeping the previous members informed of any changes to the program.

Signing up for this does NOT affect your gas rewards program.

It is easy to sign up or renew, just follow these steps:

Visit http://www.kroger.com, under Savings & Rewards, select Kroger Community Rewards

- If you have NOT signed up your Kroger Plus card online before, you will need to create an account which requires some basic information, a valid email address and your Kroger Plus card. Give it a 24 48 hrs and then try to enroll.
- You can also call Kroger customer service. Make sure you have your Kroger Plus card handy because they will need the number on the back of the card. 1-800-KROGERS (1-800-576-4377) and select option 3. Tell the agent you want to enroll your Kroger Plus card in the community rewards program. Specify that your rewards go to Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church NPO # HH690.
- If you have signed up your Kroger Plus card online before, once logged into your Kroger account, search for Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church either by name or HH690 and then click Enroll.

If you do not have a Kroger Plus card, please go to the customer service desk at any Kroger and they will help you get one.
