A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Grace & Peace to You my Friends,

We are in the season of Lent. It is often seen as a season of darkness in contrast with Advent which is seen as the season of light. Too often we are afraid of darkness but we mustn't be for sometimes in the dark we see God more brilliantly and clearly. It is in the dark that new things grow and it was from the darkness of the tomb that Christ was risen. Darkness is the womb of life and it is a place of healing. This Lenten season we are exploring the many Invitations of Christ to be participants in this life of faith. We are invited to say no, to ask questions, to feel accepted, to seek healing, to experience wholeness, to bear witness, and to claim resurrection. Years ago, I was taught at a conference that the work of ministry is to invite people along. I really like this language of invitation...we all like receiving invitations in the mail, usually they are for wonderful things like parties and weddings. How might this idea of "invitation" reshape the way in which we see life in the church? I hope that you will read this as your invitation to find your place at Quaker and to deepen your connection with this wonderful community and with Jesus.

Our identity at Christians begins with the invitation to the table...to gather with people from east and west and north and south to sit at table with our Lord and with the community. This hopeful claim is what led to the Lenten Meals...how do we intentionally gather at the table with fellow believers and remember our connectedness? I hope that you have and/or will accept the invitation to join one of these meals. Our Book Study on Thursdays dives deeper into this topic of Meeting Jesus at the Table...even if you can't come to the study I would encourage you to pick up a copy of the book to read...it is very thoughtful.

Friends, you are the hands and feet of Christ in this world...you are the ones who invite others to come and taste and see the goodness of God. I hope that you will reflect on all these "invitations" that we receive and invite others to come along too.
