### 40 days of Lent...Holy Ordinary... ideas for ways to find the Holy in our Ordinary activities and lives

"Understand this well: there is something holy, something divine hidden in the most ordinary situations, and it is up to each one of you to discover it." Josemaria Escriva

• Start this season off by collecting 2 cents a meal at every meal...make a jar to keep on your table and drop those 2 pennies in each day.

• Write thank you notes to your mail carrier, sanitation workers, dog walker, hair dresser, and other people who provide services.

• Walk around your neighborhood and pray for your neighbors as you walk

• Take a nap

Sit in silence

• Sing a favorite hymn aloud...even if you are all by yourself

• Light a candle at meal time

• Let go of 5 items in your house each week and donate them to a local agency that could use them.

• Say the Lord's Prayer as you make the bed...clean the kitchen...take out the trash.

• Count the number of times you said thank you in a day and try and remember all of those occasions and give thanks for them one more time before bedtime.

 Pray as you brush your teeth, take a shower, wash your face...pray for those who don't have access to clean water

• Attend worship each week and sit in a different pew... notice the light from the different vantages and give thanks for the faces around you.

• Work in the yard or volunteer to work in the garden at the church

• Take \$10-\$20 of quarters to a laundromat and offer to help pay for people's laundry.

• Pay attention to the ordinary activities in your daily routine... eating, bathing, laundry, dishes, walking, shopping, etc. and give thanks.
