News from the General Assembly of the PCUSA

Stated Clerk, Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson announced that he is stepping down from his position effective June 30th. He has served in this capacity since he was elected in 2016. At the most recent meeting of COGA, he had announced that he would not seek a third term, in order to give the committee time to begin the process to assemble a nominating committee. After much prayer and time with his family, he has discerned that the time is now for him to step down from the highest ecclesial office in the PCUSA. He has led our denomination through some very challenging years, including two General Assembly meetings in the time of Covid which was no small task. Dr. Nelson has said from the beginning of his tenure that the PCUSA is not dying, we are reforming. He foresees major reforms to come over the next few years and pledges his continued support for the church as it navigates where the Spirit is leading us next. Dr. Nelson has served as pastor, church planter, advocate and clerk but through it all he has been an unwavering voice for justice and inclusion. As he and his wife, Gail and daughter, Alycia make this transition into this new season may we join with all who pray for them and give thanks for his faithful service to the church.





QMPC Mission committee update from our March 28, 2023 meeting:

We approved the first quarter payments for local and international missions that we sponsor from our QMPC Mission budget in 2023. See chart below:

The committee felt that the congregation really wanted to do Rise Against Hunger on a yearly basis instead of an every other year basis. Our budget for Rise Against Hunger is \$1500 per year and the cost to do Rise Against Hunger is about \$4000 per year. We have used our budgeted \$1500 this year already! Reuben is going to apply for a grant from two-cents-a meal, we will work with the youth group and Super Bowl Sunday collection for additional funding and we will ask the congregation to help us with final funding of this very important mission that we have at QMPC. Our next Rise Against Hunger packing day is scheduled for January 28, 2024. Mark your calendar!

The QMPC Haiti Mission committee recommended to the QMPC Mission committee that we not travel to Haiti at this time due to conditions but that we sponsor six children through Haiti Outreach Ministry (HOM) on a yearly basis. QMPC has sponsored two children over the last eight years in Haiti. We have funds that we have raised for trips and supplies for Haiti and felt that this would be the best utilization of the funds. We had our first Earth Care Worship Service at QMPC on April 23, 2023. It was great! More to follow from the Earth Care Committee.

QMPC Mission Committee sponsors a Hygiene Congregational Drive for Parkview Ministry every May. You can find more information about this drive in this newsletter.

News from the Property Committee

In reference to the four vandalized air conditioners:

- After our \$2,500 deductible, Church Mutual Insurance has agreed to pay us \$14,642.93 initially with \$8,928.22 paid once repairs are complete.
- The Narthex unit was repaired and is working. The Chancel area unit has been partially repaired, and is awaiting additional parts to complete. A new unit is on order to replace the 30 year old unit in the Sanctuary.
- The session voted to investigate other options for the library at this time. Note that it is also a 30 year old unit with the air handler located above a 12ft. suspended ceiling.
- Southern Air estimates the cost to replace the Sanctuary unit and repair the Narthex and Chancel units to be \$40,879.65.

Other items to report:

- A pickup truck load of old electronic items was taken to the city collection site on April 8.
- Door stops were added to the library doors.
- Audiofetch Enabled WiFi network connection was added to enhance the worship experience for those with bluetooth compatible devices such as hearing aids or ear buds. Information signs are posted by the church hearing devices and in the vestibule.
- •Repaired outside lights by the sign on Fort Ave and South River Meeting House.
- •Plaster ceiling in kitchen was repaired.
- ${}^\bullet \textsc{Estimate}$ was obtained for painting the front offices.



Please join us on May 13 at 9:00am to spread mulch and clean out the flower beds. Bring your wheel barrows, garden gloves, rakes, etc. and help us "Spring Clean" the churchyard.

An antique rose has been added to the Church rose garden in loving memory of Becky Moore.


