Be sure to vote often and join in the FUN!!!






Join us for Haiti Outreach Ministries Day Sunday, October 19, 2025!!


Stay after church on October 19 for a Haitian meal and to hear from our special guests: Assistant Superintendent of Schools Nadege Haney, and Executive Director Bart Edwards (yes, our very own former Pastor Bart!) about God's work through Haiti Outreach Ministries in Port Au Prince, Haiti. QMPC has visited Haiti several times since 2013 to support the school students with some construction projects and a solar power project. The ministry has 3 elementary school campuses, each with a church, a school, and a clean water station. There is also a High School campus and a brand new fifth campus for a bible college, and a hospital which is under construction. QMPC currently sponsors 6 students whose photos are on a bulletin board near the elevator.

Unfortunately, mission trips were cancelled in 2020 because of the COVID pandemic and increasing political unrest in Haiti. Since then, the political situation and gang violence have not improved and continue to prevent teams from visiting Haiti. The good news is Bondye ap travay! God is working!! Despite the violence, unrest, and chaos the church is growing faster than ever, more people are turning to Christ than ever, the clinics are open when others are forced to close and all the students continue to pass their national exams with flying colors well above the national averages in Haiti. The clean water helps to keep cholera cases down in their neighborhoods while there are massive outbreaks around them.

You don't want to miss the meal of Haitian beans and rice, chicken, and creole sauce just like mission teams would be fed when visiting the ministry in Haiti while you hear and celebrate that God's kingdom is growing in Haiti without visiting teams! So sign up in the Narthex and plan to stay to hear about how to be involved in supporting student sponsorships through QMPC. Invite a friend or family member! We are trying to raise enough money to grow the endowment fund so that the interest growth on the endowment each year could cover all six of the church's sponsored students.

EARTH CARE CORNER

This year the Earth Care Committee invites our church family to reflect on the theme of Reduce-the first and most powerful of the "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" trio. Reducing our consumption is a faithful act of stewardship, honoring God's creation by minimizing waste before it begins.

Spotlight: The Environmental Cost of Drinking Water Packaging

Did you know that Americans purchase over 50 billion plastic water bottles each year? Most are used once and discarded—with only a fraction ever recycled. The environmental toll includes:

- •Plastic pollution: Bottles often end up in landfills or oceans, harming wildlife and ecosystems.
- •Carbon emissions: Manufacturing and transporting bottled water consumes fossil fuels and contributes to climate change.
- •Water waste: It takes three liters of water to produce just one liter of bottled water.

Even alternatives like aluminum cans or cartons have hidden costs—from mining impacts to energy—intensive production. The most sustainable choice? A reusable bottle filled with tap or filtered water.

Faith in Action

This month, consider making a simple switch: carry a reusable water bottle, encourage others to do the same, and support policies that reduce single-use plastics. Small choices, multiplied across our community, can lead to big change.

Let's reduce—for the Earth, for each other, and for generations to come.
