# **Adult Sunday School**



- 3) SO WHAT does this mean for our lives?
- 4) NOW WHAT is God's word calling us to do?

David Gellert, David Webb, and Bob Lockridge (who are nevertheless and otherwise just members of the class) meet on Wednesdays to look over the lesson, and will send out the Feasting guideline to prepare us for Sunday.

# Composting at QMPC

Prior to constructing the raised bed and fenced garden space we enriched our soil with a sawdust/horse manure mixture that had cured outside of Lewis and Molly Garbee's horse barn for 2 to 3 years. We now spread this mixture in the raised beds as well as on the ground garden area on a regular every other year basis. We prep the ground garden and the raised beds with a rototiller first, followed by spreading the manure/sawdust mixture about 4 inches deep and then rototill it again. Initially we checked the pH of the soil which was acidic and we continue to add 40 to 80 pounds of lime each time we amend the soil.

In 2014 we constructed four  $4' \times 4' \times 4'$  compost bins to place garden waste and leaves in to decay. Once it decayed we spread it with the sawdust/horse manure mixture, on the raised bed and fenced garden space.

When we became an Earth Care Congregation we decided to involve more people in the congregation in the process of composting for the garden. We did the following:

- 1. We visited Lynchburg Grows to see how they processed their compost from the community
- 2. We visited <a href="https://www.epa.gov/recycle/composting-home">https://www.epa.gov/recycle/composting-home</a> which outlines the materials that can and cannot be used from home for composting.
- 3. We sponsored a Tomato Sandwich Lunch after church and educated the congregation about composting. We passed out fifteen 5 gallons buckets for church members who were interested.
- 4. We contacted Lynchburg Daily Bread, asking them to provide us with two 5 gallon buckets twice weekly filled with green organic waste.
- 5. We applied for a grant from PoP Earth Care workgroup to pay for two 50 gallon compost tumblers. Using the tumblers for half a year we created 85 gallons of compost.

Sam and Josie Miller have been bringing a mixture of sawdust/chicken manure from cleaning their chicken yard and Lewis and Molly Garbee continue to bring sawdust/horse manure on an as needed bases. We are still getting four 5 gallon buckets of "Nitro-Rich Green Material" per week from Daily Bread.

With the fall coming we need for you to bring bags of dried fall leaves mulched or un-mulched in garbage bags and place the bags in front of the upper three compost bins. We will mix the "Green" material with the "Brown" material in the compost tumblers to increase our production of our compost material.
