WELCOMING ALL, SERVING CHRIST, TRANSFORMING LIVES

These are wonderful words and faithful concepts. They model Jesus' ministry here on earth. And I believe they are right on target for QMPC today and into the future. To make them live, we must not only know them by rote, but we must know what they mean to us. How they inspire us and how they make us nervous. How we are willing to inconvenience ourselves to make them true in our lives and what boundaries regarding them are we hesitant to cross. As we examine each one. we need to know what they mean to us personally and what we think they mean to other members. We need to corporately speak them when considering and discussing the ministry, mission and programs options that we have in front of us.

Of the three phrases in our mission statement, I think that QMPC serves others very well. Many of our members serve through a large number of organizations in this local area and even around the world. We genuinely care about other members and go out of our way to provide for someone's needs when they arise. One question might be: do we reach out to members equally or just those we know well? Which places attention on the first phrase: Welcoming all.

We certainly are good at being friendly to each other and enjoying each other's company. But what does it means to welcome all? Who in our community represents all? How are we welcoming to members we know least well? How open are we to the stranger? Who do we think belongs at QMPC? How can other members serve as role models to us? Transforming lives is the least tangible of the three phrases and we acknowledge that the Holy Spirit does most of the work. We primarily provide the opportunity and let people know they are loved and valued.

I am excited that we are putting actual programs and mission efforts into play to bring our mission to life in tangible ways. We are emphasizing intergenerational programs and have a new Senior High through Adult Bible Study Class to be held during Sunday School. We have added a daytime Spiritual Nurture class and programs for health issues that seniors struggle with.

In October we will begin a six week program called "Terrific Tuesdays" designed for all generations. We will gather at 6:00 PM for a simple supper and hopefully sit with folks we know the least. After dinner we will spend a few minutes having fun engaging in an intergenerational activity that enhances our fellowship time together. The Preschoolers will then go to a classroom to watch a Bible based video. The Elementary School kids, Middle School and Senior High Youth will have time to work on their homework with coaching and tutoring from adults. The rest of the adults will spend time in one of several spiritual nurture programs. At 7:25 we will gather for prayer and then end having eaten, worked on home work and spiritual growth, and enjoyed fellowship time with members of all ages. I hope you will join us in this program as we Welcome All, Serve Christ and Transform Lives Together.

Capital Campaign


As part of our discernment process we created a property task force. Their job was twofold to access what was needed in repairs for our building and to look at how the building was being used and how it could be used in the future.



Children's Choirs begin September 8!



- If you have signed up your Kroger Plus card online before, once logged into your Kroger account, search for Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church either by name or HH690 and then click Enroll.
