Paul writes in the letter to the Romans 5:1-5"Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us. because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

About the middle of June this pandemic began to feel like a marathon and now it feels more like a never ending endurance contest. "Surely by summer things will begin to get back to normal." And while businesses opened and some churches began having in-person worship, normal became a tug of war over wearing masks, social distancing and only gathering in small groups. "How long do you want us to be patient Lord?" To which Paul replies that God's promise of the forgiveness of sins and life eternal is realized by faith. And because of our faith we have peace with the Lord and can boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And we can also boast in our sufferings, knowing that they produce endurance, and endurance produces character and character produces hope and hope lives in us because the Holy Spirit and God's love has been poured into our hearts.

God knows that our practice of faith during tough times produces strength and Godly character, and also hope because we are not alone nor forsaken. God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit walks with us and gives us what we need to be at peace even when we are bored, lonely, frightened or discouraged. For many others this time is one of God's blessings that come with less cluttered days, time for quiet reflection and family gatherings and a new ways of understanding God's presence.

Paul is essentially saying that Faith is not an event, it is a lifestyle which we get to practice in good times and hard times under the leadership of God. May we all find ways to endure and to celebrate during this very unique time in our lives. Praise be to God!


SESSION MEETING

The Mission Committee is thrilled to announce that QMPC will be part of Habitat for Humanity's Apostle's Build starting this September. This is an incredible way to serve mankind, be the feet and hands of Jesus in our

community, and help provide a home for a local family. We will be building a house for Adrienne Toler, single mother of 2 children, age 12 & 7. She works full time for Centra Health and is very excited to have a home for her children. They have been living in 110 year old house with foundation issues, leaking roof and constant plumbing problems which have exasperated allergies. She feels a sense of ownership when putting in her "sweat equity". She is so thankful to have been chosen for this new, clean, affordable home.

WHAT IS AN APOSTLES BUILD?

- Churches work together to build a Habitat house.
- They raise funds and provide volunteers.

BENEFITS

- Gives people a concrete way to put their faith into action
- Allows people of faith to be the body of Christ outside of their church walls
- Congregation can experience revitalization
- Creates potential to build community among churches
- Volunteers meet new people and develop relationships with individuals from their own church

QMPC HISTORY

• QMPC has been involved with Habitat for Humanity in the greater Lynchburg area since 1991. We were a part of the 9th Apostle's Build and this year is the 309th build! During this time, we have participated in 10 builds and donated \$68,715.76 to them. Our goal has always been to help the community through this organization.

COMMUNITY

- QMPC is joining with 12 local churches* to help build this home. Work begins September 1 and the goal is to complete the home by December 12.
- The cost of the build is \$72,000 and so far \$55,000 has been raised by these 12 churches.

 Our work days are September 30, October 1 and October 3 from 8 AM to 3 PM.
- Our crew will help install siding and build a porch. We will also provide lunches for the work crew on our days.

*Churches involved include: St. Thomas Moore Catholic Church, Quaker Memorial Presbyterian, Peakland UMC, Heritage UMC, Bethany UMC, Mountain View UMC, First Unitarian Church, Boonsboro Presbyterian, St. Andrew's Presbyterian, Grace Memorial Episcopal, Timberlake Christian Church, Temple of Deliverance

- Project management by a trained and compassionate staff
- Selection of the qualified, hard-working family who will purchase the home
- Support and coordination of Volunteers ensuring that everyone has a GREAT experience in mission and fellowship
- Ongoing relationship with each church


- Site Information
