A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR


Grace & Peace to You my Friends,

Christian Doctrine by Shirley Guthrie



Amherst Presbyterian looking for bunk beds

Did you know that Amherst Presbyterian Church (where Michael Whorley is the Supply Pastor) along with Sweet Briar College has a refugee relief program? The program currently has a Syrian family that has located to the area and they are setting the family up with a home. They are in need of bunk beds for some of the children in the family. Are you interested in learning more about composting? Are you passionate about feeding the hungry?

The Garden & Earth Care teams have a new project and we would like your help. Each year, during the garden season, we purchase many bags of garden soil to fill in our beds. If we do a better job of composting, we can make our own soil and reduce our expenses. We are asking any interested members to get a compost bucket from the garden team. The bucket will be labeled with acceptable items and will have a lid. Fill this bucket up each week with your kitchen waste products and bring it to the church each Sunday or whenever it's full. A team member will dump it in our new composter and rinse your bucket out to return home for more compost. We will mix this compost with manure from Lewis and Mollie's houses and leaf mixture from the leaves on the church yard. Next spring, we will have made our own rich garden soil. Even if you don't work in the garden, you will be helping feed the hungry by providing our soil and reducing our expenses. Each year, QMPC donates over 1000 lbs of food to help feed the hungry. At present we have donated over 400 pounds of vegetables to Salvation Army, Daily Bread and the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank. If you are interested, contact the office and they'll put you in contact with a team member.

We have already picked and delivered over 500 pounds of vegetables to the Salvation Army and Food Bank this Spring and Summer. Join us every Monday and Thursday morning at 9 am to help pick our Garden's bounty!


