

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Several folks have asked for a copy of the remarks I made at the opening of worship on July 14 in response to the attempted assassination of former president Trump. My letter to you this month is a copy of those words but with this added this plea....as this election season ramps up and the vitriol heightens to a frenzy may we find ways to engage one another with care and compassion instead of anger and fury. May we choose the way we engage in the conversations around the election with thoughtful discourse and not hateful division. Let us resist cheap shots and pettiness and instead practice mutual forbearance with one another. I pray for our country as we enter this season and may we remember that we are people of The Way of Jesus and may we behave accordingly.

I know that many of us went to bed last night or awoke this morning to the news of an attempted assassination of the former president, Trump. It is news that has shocked us and has reminded us that political violence is always waiting to spring into action. I am grateful that this attempt was unsuccessful...I pray for his healing and I grieve for all the lives lost in yesterday's actions and my prayer is that we will rise above the divisions that continue to tear the cloth of democracy in our country and keep us from being truly at peace. The darkest hours of American history, the ones shadowed by political violence, remind us that incitement and hatred must be constantly challenged. Now is the time for a unified voice to stand up and say...ENOUGH...it is time to stop cheering on the pundits and candidates that use incendiary language. Maybe John Prine was right...it is time for us to blow up our tvs and throw away our papers. We all play a role in this whether we want to believe it or not...every time we turn on cable news for hours on end...every time we share a mean-spirited meme on social media...every time we fan the flames of violent rhetoric...every time we feed the social discourse of our side is better than your side...every time we throw our hands up in the air and declare both sides are bad and there is nothing we can do...my friends Pogo said it and it is still true: We have met the enemy and he is us...we continue to feed the billion dollar media behemoth with our participation and our apathy. We must raise our unified voices and say the time of division is over. Violence has no place in a democratic society and we must stop the current political situation that benefits destruction, violence, evil and division. There is enough love and compassion to go around. We must make a commitment to peace. As the beloved people of God we are called to be a unique people of peace not just in our own communities but into all the world. Violence only begets more violence...whether it is violent rhetoric or violent actions...I urge us to be a people of peace...to use the language of peace...to speak with peace whenever we can...to promote peace in ever corner of our lives from our nuclear families to our social media footprint. We cannot forget that Jesus says to us: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Fear Mongering is the exact opposite of peace...don't give in to the temptation to drum up conspiracy theories and point fingers, it only adds fuel to the fire of evil. My friends as we gather in this time to worship together let us begin by practicing peace here in this place. It has been our custom for quite some time to give a very passive sign of peace to our neighbors...but today, I invite you to get up, move around the room, shake hands/embrace/make eye contact as you feel comfortable and truly greet one another with the Peace of Jesus...for it is the only peace that can change the world.

The Church Office will be closed Monday, September 2 for the Labor Day holiday.




Massanetta Springs Sunday


