
#### **CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, OCTOBER 8**

# Scotland Tour 2024

An initial deposit of \$195 is due by October 29, 2023 to receive the early bird discount for a \$100 savings. All balances on the trip will need to be paid by July 10, 2024. The trip will include Edinburgh, Iona, St. Andrews, Loch Ness, Stirling, Culloden and an opportunity to explore Scotland's sacred heritage. A full brochure with all the details will be in the office soon...but we have been guaranteed 18 spots on this tour until January 2024 (so don't miss out on the opportunity). 
